AIDS - ALASKA

Through June 30, 1994, 226 Alaskans have been confirmed to have AIDS. Of these, 139 are known to have died. Of the 226 AIDS cases, 199 are in males and 27 in females. Data below employ the 1993 Expanded Case Definition for AIDS. All cases are shown as diagnosed in the year the person first met the revised case definition. Residence at time of diagnosis is shown by census area. Note: Data for 1994 are for the first 6 months only.






Cumulative Cases  
Based on Date of Diagnosis




Risk Category, <sup>1</sup> N = 226
