AIDS - ALASKA

Through December 31, 1996, 369 Alaskans have been confirmed to have AIDS. Of these, 194 (53%) are known to have died. Of the 369 AIDS cases, 322 (87%) are in males and 47 (13%) in females. Data below employ the 1993 Expanded Case Definition for AIDS. All cases are shown as diagnosed in the year the person first met the revised case definition. Residence at time of diagnosis is shown by census area.






Cases and Known Deaths
by Year of Diagnosis, N = 369




Exposure Category¹
