AIDS - ALASKA

Through June 30, 1997, 394 Alaskans have been confirmed to have AIDS. Of these, 197 (50%) are known to have died. Of the 394 AIDS cases, 342 (87%) are male and 52 (13%) are female. Data below employ the 1993 Expanded Case Definition for AIDS. All cases are shown as diagnosed in the year the person first met the revised case definition. Residence at time of diagnosis is shown by census area. Note: 1997 data are for the period January through June, 1997 only.






**Cases and Known Deaths**  
by Year of Diagnosis, N = 394




**Exposure Category <sup>1</sup>**
